First Aid Kit

General requirements

- First Aid is being able to provide immediate help if someone is taken ill or injured.
- Depending on national and local legislation, as a minimum, you should have:
 - A suitably stocked first aid kit. In larger hotels multiple first-aid kits should be positioned at various locations.
 - An appointed person or people to take charge of first aid arrangements.
 - Information for all employees telling them about first aid arrangements.
- The contents of a first aid kit should be based on what your needs are – historical what type of injuries occur at your hotel? For example, if you get lots of small cuts, you'll need lots of plasters.
- The kit needs to be checked regularly. Many items, particularly sterile ones, are marked with expiry dates. Expired items need to be replaced and disposed of safely. If a sterile item doesn't have an expiry date, check with the manufacturer to find out how long it can be kept. For non-sterile items without dates, you should check that they are still fit for purpose.

Minimum items

- The suggested items that should be included in a minimum first aid kit are:
 - Individually wrapped Sterile Plasters of assorted sizes
 - Sterile Eye Pads
 - Individually wrapped Triangular bandages
 - Safety pins
 - Individually wrapped sterile wound dressings large and medium-sized
 - Disposable gloves
 - Moist wipes
 - Scissors
