<p>TUI UK & Ireland</p>	<p>We are continually reviewing our holiday programme and cancellations in line with the Government updates every 3 weeks.</p> <p>Due to ongoing uncertainty around travel to some countries, we have unfortunately had to cancel holidays to the following destinations:</p> <p>Up to and including 31 July: Aruba, Greece, (Halkidiki, Prevesa, Samos, Thassos & Santorini), Italy, Morocco (AGA), Mainland Spain (except AGP & ALC). TUI Lakes & Mountains holidays.</p> <p>Holidays which include non-TUI flights to Canada, Kenya, Seychelles and Tobago remain cancelled up to including 31 July.</p> <p>Holidays to Cape Verde, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Egypt, Florida, Mexico, Turkey and Tunisia have been cancelled up to and including 15 August.</p> <p>We have also cancelled holidays which include non-TUI flights to India, Indonesia, Maldives, Mauritius, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Thailand (Phuket), UAE and USA up to and including 15 August.</p> <p>Holidays to Cuba remain cancelled up to and including 31 August</p>	<p>Customers from the UK are able to travel overseas on holiday following a traffic light system introduced by the UK Government with Green, Amber and Red destinations. More information about the current system is available at the end of this summary update.</p> <p>TUI UK is operating to the following Green destinations: Madeira, Malta, Porto Santo, and Antigua, Barbados, Iceland, Gibraltar and Jersey (from 1 August). <p>TUI Netherlands</p>	<p>Following the changes announced by the Dutch Govt on 14 July, the following destinations have a negative travel advisory from 16 July. Therefore package holidays to Spain (including the Canary Islands and the Balearic Islands), Portugal mainland and Cyprus are cancelled up to and including 13 August 2021.</p> <p>All other Sun & Beach package holidays to Turkey, Egypt, Morocco, Tunisia and all other long haul destinations are cancelled up to and including 30 September 2021.</p>	<p>Based on the Dutch government traffic light system TUI operations have started to destinations which have a positive advisory and which do not require travellers to quarantine upon arrival.</p> <p>Operations have restarted to Bulgaria, Croatia (SPU, PUY), Greece destinations (with the exception of Kavala/Thassos & Skiathos), Italy, Malta, Madeira, Aruba, Azores (PDL & TER), Curacao, Bonaire and St Martin.</p> <p>Operations are planned to restart to the following destinations:</p> <p>19 July: North Macedonia</p>

TUI France

TUI France continues to operate to Club Lookea and Club Marmara in the following destinations: Kos, Corfu, Crete, Athens, Sicily, Sardinia, Spain (Andalucia), Majorca, Fuerteventura, Lanzarote, Bulgaria, Croatia, Morocco and Portugal, Zanzibar & the Dominican Republic .

UK Government Traffic Light System

Customers from the UK are able to travel overseas on holiday following a traffic light system introduced by the UK Government with Green, Amber and Red destinations. The colour category a country falls into defines the testing, self-isolation or quarantine requirements when re-entering the UK after travelling. TUI will only fly to destinations on the Green and Amber list and where the Foreign Commonwealth and Development Office travel advice allows. TUI will not operate to Red listed countries.

Amber listed Countries:

From **04.00hrs on Monday 19 July**, residents of the UK arriving from an Amber destination who have been double vaccinated by the UK National Health Service (NHS) and 14 days have passed since their second vaccination, will no longer need to self-isolate or take a Day 8 test when returning home from an Amber country.

Children aged between 5 and 17 who are travelling with a fully vaccinated adult will only need to take a day 2 test and be exempt from self-isolation. Children aged 4 and under will be exempt from all testing and self-isolation requirements.

Adults over 18 returning from Amber destinations to the UK after **04.00hrs on Monday 19 July** who are not double vaccinated, or travelled back from France, in the 10 days before returning to England, will still need to self-isolate and follow Amber testing requirements.

The following measures will also remain in place:

- Travellers must take a covid-19 test before travel
- Travellers must pay for a covid-19 test on day 2 after arrival in the UK

Green listed countries

Green entry requirements will still apply - the Antigen test before flying home and the Day 2 PCR test after returning will still be required.
